Poked numerous times for hours, ignore by officials standing ring side when asking for help, as it was all clearly going wrong, put in a headlock, whispered to ... "this is for your own good," medical professionals-sworn to do no harm, encouraging them to accept the lethal cocktail because the nitrogen would cause them to die a terrible death. People standing up for justice being falsely accused of hijacking a known corrupt system. Santa's checking his list "TWICE," and he knows who has been naughty or nice. Political propaganda being panhandled by a protagonist who seeks to spread hate and vengeance, while turkeys are being stuffed and Christmas trees lit. Project Hope to Abolish the Death Penalty's response to Gov. Ivey's call for a halt to executions pending a review by the Department of Corrections.

Characterizing the problems as anything other than DOC incompetence is not only misleading, it's missing the point. ADOC cannot be allowed to investigate itself, there has to be an independent and impartial panel of experts to not only review what is going wrong, but to "pull back the curtain" to provide transparency for every step in the process, beginning with the arbitrary process prosecutors use to decide which cases should be tried capitally, how innocent men like Toforest Johnson, Chris Barbour, and Jarrod Taylor continue to languish on death row when the Attorney General's office knows they don't belong here. Judicial override is another issue to tackle, it never should have had a place in our judicial system, and now that it has been remedied going forward, this would be a great opportunity to address the unconstitutionality of those sentenced to death against the wishes of a jury. The harsh treatment of the families (on both sides) and the inhumane job of executioner allso degrades us as a society. We believe that this de facto moratorium is the perfect opportunity to do what we sout out to do from the start, educate people about what really goes on in capital cases.


Alabama News

Fourth Quarter 2022

- * We are grateful to Dr. Katie Owens-Murphy (Whose book, a PHADP collaboration "Ghosts Over the Boiler" will be available in Feb. 2023) for presenting alongisde Derek Malone at the American Society for Criminology conference in Atlanta, "Archiving for the future: Documenting the death penalty in Alabama." They hope that researchers will use the archives to center the voices and experiences of those most directly impacted by capital punishment.
- * We were honored to meet (via our Executive Director Esther Brown) with Honorable Eline Goovaerts, the Deputy Consul General of Belgium, to share with her about human rights aspects of the death penalty as well as potential future collaborations with the Belgian Consulate.
- Thank you to all of our supporters who protested, gathered, prayed, gave, and voted in the recent election. Our efforts continue to bear fruit in and out of Alabama. We are especially thankful for those have continued to support us financially, we know that money is tight and we appreciate you all making us, and our issue a priority.
- * As many of you may know, after a string of bungled executions and execution attempts (the latest being Kenny Smith's), Gov. Ivey has ordered a halt to all executions pending a top-tobottom review of the execution process, and in doing so has enacted a de facto moratorium. This is an acknowledgement that they have been putting band-aids on a broken system for too long. While we applaud an investigation, we feel that it should be conducted by an impartial and independent third party.
- * We have been overwhelmed by the generosity of many local ministries who have provided meals for the men at Holman, thank you for filling our bellies and our spirits.
- * We appreciate the two Special Rapporteurs of the United Nations Human Rights Council, Morris Tidball-Binz and Alice Jill Edwards for urging the United States to safeguard the rights of its citizens and halt executions pending a review.

But what stood out the most to me is when I wasn't able to feed myself, bathe myself, or use the restroom on my own, I was cared for with much kindness and dignity by the nurses and doctors there at the free world hospital.

It was a very humbling experience for someone like myself, full of pride, who is used to doing for myself and not depending on others.

Also, I would like to thank the practical nurse and nursing staff here at this prison who were very instrumental in my recovery during my stay in the infirmary and release on Feb 10, 2021. I am thankful and appreciative to you all, May God bless and reward you all, as I have been richly blessed. Amen.



The Night Before Christmas



Christmas: Mas Christ


