
Seasons Greeting's -----

Systematic Theology from Death Row (Casey McWhorter & Jeff Hood)

Why do we allow our minds to stop? We too often assume that the end is the end. Many assume that death is the end because we dare not imagine any other way. We dare not because we think we are so much more enlightened than everyone else. Heaven and angels sound foolish amid the stark reality of a dead body. Maybe what we're talking about is far more logical than fairy tales. Love is something that we know...even if we can't explain it. You see, we believe in what we feel because we know what we feel. Love exists. But can it die? Logic would force most to say yes. How can a dead body love? Perhaps, love is not wedded to the body. Perhaps, love is so much greater than anything that we could imagine...even death. To the doubters, we invite them to prove us wrong. If one could prove that love is an energy that dies, then we could stop the conversation right now. You can't. There is absolutely no way to prove that love dies...there is too much love that sticks around after death...but you can prove that it lives. Something that exists without death is immortal. Love is immortal.

The end is not the end. There is no stranger theological declaration. It forces us to reconsider everything that seems so obvious. Love always invites us to look beyond prepackaged answers...to a place beyond comprehension. What is...is not what will always be. What will always be is not always what is. Time becomes strange and warped amidst thoughts about endings. We must hold on to what we know. Whether by absence or presence, we know love. We know what we have. We know what we want. We know what we desperately yearn for. Love is the assurance of things hoped for. Can you kill hope? Our consciousness hopes for love at its' very core. Hope never dies. The idea and desire for love...lives. The end is but a beginning.

Meet us at the gates of heaven. Then again, why would there be any gates? Heaven is supposed to be open for all. Maybe a better way to say it is...meet me along the way to where love is taking us.

We work with prisons/jails anywhere in the country. Some places for many years to help build up the libraries. Others for shorter stretches. The big thing for me is that the facilities request the books. We don't send them randomly or without a request and a person to accept them and get them to people.

NOW what I want to say is that yesterday I opened Ghosts Over the Boiler for the first time and started to read. This is an absolutely wonderful book!!! There are many aspects to it. The primary one, for me, is that it speaks to the time we're in. People on death row, with all that was/is working against them, have joined together to educate themselves, to find ways to live and work together, to create intensely strong and supportive connections, to express sometimes radically different feelings and viewpoints, to learn ways to both hold their own experiences and opinions without cutting other people off... isn't this EXACTLY what we so vitally need in the world today?? In Israel and Gaza. In the Ukraine and Russia. With all of the groups and people, cultures and countries! And this is being done by a group of people who were thrown together with nothing into appalling conditions! The wisdom rolls off the pages! And what continues to grow is HOPE... in the face of a death sentence and in a place where many of your closest friends/family are facing the same in a system awash in injustice!

My brain is now at work imagining people who we could get this book to and how we could get a broader audience. Please thank everyone there for the work they are doing to benefit everyone on the planet. It's almost like people (those on death row in Alabama) were selected and tossed into an intensive "think tank" to answer questions and find real solutions to the problems that could well be devastating all the people and beings and the planet itself.

You are all a simply incredible group of individuals who I am extraordinarily grateful to have touched my life.

Then we would go in the house cause me and my brother would be cold, as well. We would warm up but be back out there in another hour with our friends.

Just helping my mother make M&M cookies, eating handfulls of M&M's as she turned her back. We are kids what kid didn't like plain M&M's? She didn't care beacuse she had more than enough for the cookies, plus i wanted my whole 2 racks of cookies. I didn't share mine and she made them for the 4 kids but you know i was greedy. M&M cookies and milk was something serious backthen. And heck, i wouldn't mind some at this moment!!

REFLECTIONS

As I sat writing a letter a few days ago (mid-October) I saw my first Christmas commercial of the year. It was an ad for a Christmas Carol CD. Christmas music puts me in a festive mood and I've always loved this time of year. Something about this particular holiday tends to start me reflecting on my life, more than any other time of year. Everyone wishes to be happy at Christmastime and I'm no exception. Sometimes I even attain the joy and peacefulness I seek but then I start reflecting again, and playing the "What if" game and a kind of mental tug of war ensues.

Christmas leads me directly to thoughts of family and I start thinking about the things I'll probably never experience: getting married, having a family, a home and career. Once that starts, my festive mood goes out the window, but not for the self-pitying reasons some might think. As soon as I start feeling sorry for myself, I get angry and disgusted with myself because it was my own life-style and life choices that allowed for the circumstances that landed me on death row. Doing drugs and drinking so much that I would often have to take the "morning after" walk around my car to see if I'd crashed into anything or anyone the night before.

The victims of violent crime, and their surviving families, get to make no choices on whether or not they will be victims. It's like being struck by lightning. It doesn't matter how virtuously they lead their lives, how many right and good choices they make, or how loving and kind hearted they are to their fellow man. They still get no choice, and it's not fair.

When I think about all the victims of violent crime and their loved ones, who are victims as well, I can't help but be embarrassed for feeling sorry for things that I miss. I feel I have little or no right to pity myself and it shames me that I can't stop it completely.

I hope that murder victim's families everywhere can find a way to cope with their loss and have a happy and love filled holiday season.

It's a little harder for me to get into the holiday spirit while in prison, and like many people who are on the street, it's the best and worst time of year. I'll probably spend Christmas Eve listening to Christmas music, dreaming and pretending that I'm not in prison. Although I'll try not to, I'll probably think about everything I'm missing but the victims are never far from my mind.

May they all find some semblance of normalcy and happiness this Christmas and in the new year. My thoughts, well wishes, and sympathy remain with them. I wish everyone a Merry Christmas, Happy Chanukah, Festive Kwanza, and a Happy New Year!!
