- Tuesday, Jan 23 on the steps of the capitol in Montgomery a rally, protest, and vigil was held. Protesting state killing, specifically the gassing of Kenny Smith, rallying for reconcilliation, not retrubution. Many thanks to those who showed up, participated, spoke, and a special shoutout to those who organized, coordinated, funded, and essentially made it happen.
- Representing us, our Executive Director Esther Brown, spoke about the awful antiquated practice of judicial override, and said of Alabama, we can do better, we must do better.
- * Advisory Board member Rev. Lynn Hopkins acted as emcee for the event, and was just incredible!
- * Representing Amnesty International protesting this and all executions was T.J. Riggs.
- * Claire Milligan shared a letter from Sarah Gregory, who couldn't make it because she was advocating for us elsewhere. In the letter she offered love and support for Kenny's wife Dee, as she knows what those closest to the condemned go through.
- Alabama Rep. Jeremy Gray had this to say "I work for the people, but I stand with the people when they're right
- Advisory Board member Gary Drinkard was joined by two other Witness to Innocence members, Randall Padgett and Ron White saying that God had saved Kenny once, and we were asking Him to do it again. And as Ron White pointed out, executions change nothing, benefits no one, and it's time to stop.
- Julie Conradi from the Birmingham congregation of Unitarian Universalists urged Alabama not to bring back gassing our people.
- * Shake the Field performed and got the crowd going with this chant "They want Executions" "That's not the Solution!"
- * Long time friend, advocate, and Advisory Board member Sen. Hank Sanders was, as he put it "a human being, calling on the human being of Gov. Ivey" not to go forward with this business of killing.

- * AL NAACP president Bernard Simelton simply asked Gov. Ivey to pray about it.
- * Abe Bonowitz from DPA who was instrumental in bringing this all together did what he does best. Thank you for doing what you do Abe.
- * Rev. Dr. Jeff Hood shared his many fears about what was to come, many of which came to pass. He boldly invited Gov. Ivey to come stand next to him and witness the atrocities she helped perpetuate against Kenny Smith.

I would love to say we planned it that way, but that was orchestrated on a much higher level. The state of Alabama told the world that it planned to start gassing its citizens and proceeded to do just that. The world since Alabama's proud declaration has been up in arms, utterly shocked, horrified, and mortified at the brazen audacity of the thoughtless leaders of Alabama to revisit one of the most vile stains in the history of the world perpetrated by Adolf Hitler, but certainly Hitler had to smile a little bit.

The state of Alabama told Kenneth Eugene Smith that on January 25th, 2024 that they would attempt to make him the guinea pig for their experimental nitrogen asphyxiation execution method and they did just that. Despite numerous warnings that Mr. Smith would be tortured, in a November court filing, the director of the assisted suicide organization Exit International wrote that "It is difficult to see how an effective air-seal could be initially established, let alone maintained, without Mr. Smith's participation and cooperation! The director, a medical doctor, noted that very few details about Alabama's execution protocol have been publicly released. He concluded "there is good reason to be concerned about the planned procedure," and that "there is a significant possibility that Mr. Smith will be subject to incomplete cerebral hypoxia," and experience permanent brain damage. Which would draw the attention and ire of the United Nations, who found that Mr. Smith's subsequent execution would be a violation of international law as University of Oxford Death Penalty Research Unit, Professor John Bessler argues that since psycholigical torture is prohibited under the most fundamental principles of international law and since death threats are a form of psychological torture, then governmental death threats as part of the death penalty are torturous and a violation of international law. Death threats are an integral part of death sentences, from the time they are pronounced to the time they are either carried out or overturned.

What constitutes torture must be determined by an act's objective characteristics, not by how state officials characterized an act. For too long torture and capital punishment have been considered in seperate legal silos. He concludes that international law should categorize the death penalty as torture per se.

Knowing all this, Alabama did as it said it would do. They gassed one of their citizens. And like everyone told them, it went wrong. It took 30 minutes for Mr. Smith to die, "we think" Not the 3 - 5 minutes the state said it would. Then they ask the other states in the U.S. to try it on their own citizens also like it was something good. The state of Alabama is really out here promoting torture, and telling other states that the UN and the rest of the world, has no say in what they do to their citizens.

It's like Alabama is saying "Down here in the south we do what we want to , we don't care about international law, the UN, and anyone else that thinks it can tell us what to do. we will kill our citizens how we want to.
